Military intervention has become an option for a few affluent resource hungry nations. We note time and again that underdeveloped nations that fall victim to horrendous events and appalling

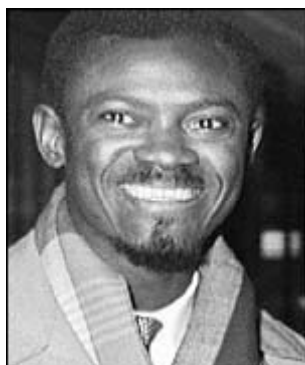
circumstances are neglected if there are no resources to exploit. The present intervention in Timor is transparent and so are the circumstances that inflamed the present melee.
