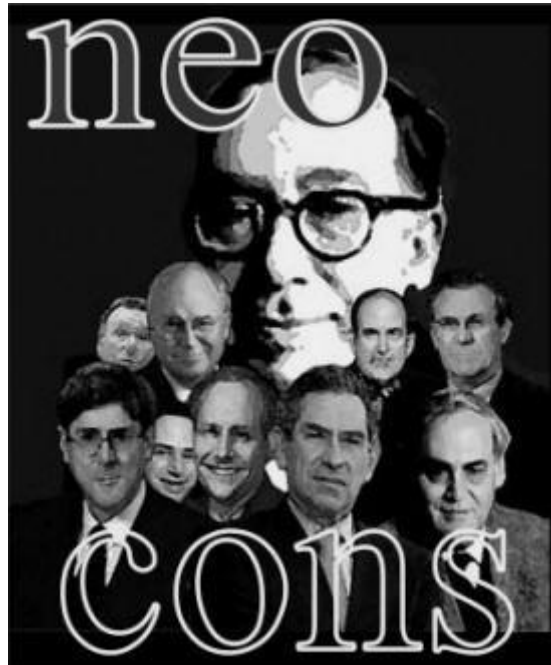


Shifting Values and the New Barbarism
