Aspects of Asymmetric Post-Modern Warfare

I recently received a chain email, which was a good example of a poorly planned and counterproductive propaganda ploy designed to boost support for the occupation forces in Iraq. I have since misplaced it, however, the following accurately reflects the general tone and content: 'I'm a Marine, I'm made of steel, I am superman, I eat nails for breakfast, I am invincible etc, etc'. The person who originally mailed this piece of poorly planned propaganda forgot to consider the broader picture – costly oversights are also characteristic of the present Bush administration, but to continue:

Enemy combatants are acutely aware of their limitations; they go to great lengths to preserve their extremely vulnerable flesh and blood bodies in combat. The enemy delights in opponents who are divorced from the realities of war and imagine themselves to be somehow superior or 'made of steel'. The bodies of these arrogant idiots litter the battlefields of the world. Whoever originally posted that imbecilic poem was doing the enemy a favour, but America has a bad habit of always shooting itself in the head.

A gem from today's post-modern warfare 'manual' follows: "one expert sniper is worth one thousand regular troops and one expert propagandist is worth one thousand snipers." A modern fighting force and culture would disregard these simple strategies at their own peril.
